





LIST KSIĘDZA PROBOSZCZA

Drodzy Parafianie i Przyjaciele,

Dzisiaj Ewangelia przedstawia konsternację, jaką przeżywali współziomkowie Jezusa w jego obecności: «Czyż to nie jest Jezus, syn Józefa, którego ojca i matkę my znamy? Jakżeż może On teraz mówić: "Z nieba

zstąpiłem» (J 6,42). Życie Jezusa wsród swoich było tak normalne, że rozpoczęcie głoszenia Królestwa, wzburzało tych, którzy go znali.

O jakim Ojcu, którego nikt nie widział, mówił im Jezus? Kim był ten chleb, który zstąpił z nieba, który sprawi, że spożywający go będą żyć wiecznie? ... «Chlebem, który Ja dam, jest moje ciało za życie świata» (J 6,51)...

Kim jest Jezus? Wiele mężczyzn i kobiet przed nami zadawało sobie to pytanie, osobiście na nie odpowiedzieli i poszli do Jezusa, naśladowali Go i teraz cieszą się życiem bez końca pełnym miłości. A ci, którzy do niego pójdą, zostaną wskrzeszeni w dniu ostatecznym (cf. J 6,44). Jan Kasjan nawoływał swoich mnichów słowami: «'Zbliżcie się do Boga, a Bóg zbliży się do was', ponieważ 'nikt nie może przyjść do Jezusa, jeśli go nie pociągnie Ojciec, który go posłał' (...) W Ewangelii słuchamy Pana, który zaprasza nas byśmy do Niego przyszli: 'Przyjdźcie do mnie wszyscy, którzy utrudzeni i obciążeni jesteście, a Ja was pokrzepię'». Przyjmijmy Słowo Ewangelii, które przybliża nas do Jezusa każdego dnia; przyjmijmy zaproszenie płynące z Ewangelii do wejścia w komunię z Nim, spożywając Jego ciało, gdyż «oto jest prawdziwy pokarm, ciało Chrystusa, które będąc Słowem, stało się dla nas ciałem» (Orygenes).

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Today, the Gospel shows how puzzled Jesus' compatriots were when in his presence: «This man is the son of Joseph, isn't he? We know his father and mother. How can he say that he has come from heaven?» (Jn 6:42). The life

of Jesus amongst his own people had been so normal that, when He began with the proclamation of the Kingdom, those who knew him were shocked at what He was saying. What Father was Jesus referring to, whom nobody had ever seen before? Which could be that living bread coming from heaven that those who eat of it would live forever? ... «The bread I shall give is my flesh and I will give it for the life of the world» (Jn 6:51)...

Who is Jesus? Many men and women before us have asked themselves the same question, have personally answered it, have gone to Jesus, have followed him and now they enjoy an endless life full of love. And those who now may come to Jesus, He will raise them up on the last day. (cf. Jn 6:44). John Cassian exhorted his monks by telling them: «'Come close to God, and He will come close to you', because 'nobody can come to Jesus unless he is drawn by the Father who sent Him' (...). In the Gospel we listen to the Lord inviting us to join Him: 'You who are burdened and overwhelmed, come to me and I will make you rest'». Let us welcome the Word of the Gospel that every day brings us nearer to Jesus; let us welcome the invitation of the very Gospel to enter into communion with Him by eating his flesh, because «This is the true food, Christ's flesh, which being Word has become flesh, as it is said 'And the Word became flesh'» (Origen).






St. Maksymilian Maria Kolbe, original name Rajmund Kolbe, (born January 8, 1894, Zduńska Wola, near Lodz, Russian Empire [now in Poland]—died August 14, 1941, Auschwitz [now Oświęcim]; feast day August 14), canonized October 10, 1982), Franciscan priest and religious founder martyred by the Nazis for aiding Jewish refugees during World War II.

In 1906 young Kolbe had a vision of the Virgin Mary in which she offered him a white crown and a red crown and asked which he would accept. Understanding the white to represent a life of purity and the red to represent martyrdom, he said he would accept them both. The vision deeply affected him, and the following year he and his elder brother joined the Franciscan Conventuals. In 1912 he went to Rome, where he studied theology and philosophy at the Pontifical Gregorian University. In 1917 he founded the sodality (i.e., devotional association) of the Militia of Mary Immaculate, thus making a significant contribution to the international Marian movement. In 1918 he was ordained a priest. Returning to Poland, he established the popular Roman Catholic periodical Rycerz Niepokalanej ("The Knight of Mary Immaculate") and in 1927 founded the City of Mary Immaculate (Niepokalanów), a religious centre, that eventually attracted some 700 friars and workers. A fervent devotee of the Virgin Mary, he later founded sister institutions in Japan

Upon his return to Poland, Kolbe became superior of the City of Mary Immaculate and director of Poland's chief Catholic publishing complex. In 1938 the centre started its own radio station. He was arrested by the Gestapo in 1939 for his anti-Nazism but was later released. He and the remaining brothers used the centre to shelter an estimated 2,000-3,000 Polish refugees, the majority of whom were Jewish, and continued to publish anti-Nazi publications. He was again arrested in February 1941 on charges of aiding Jews and the Polish underground. He was imprisoned at Warsaw and then shipped to Auschwitz. There he continued his priestly ministry, including hearing confessions and holding mass with smuggled bread, for which he was subjected to beatings by the guards. Following a prisoner's escape, 10 men were randomly selected to die as punishment, and Kolbe volunteered his life in the place of Franciszek Gajowniczek, who was married with young children. Kolbe and the other nine prisoners were starved for weeks until he and the few others who were still alive were finally injected with carbolic acid and cremated.

On October 17, 1971, Kolbe was beatified by Pope Paul VI, the first Nazi victim to be proclaimed blessed by the Roman Catholic Church. In 1982 Pope John Paul II canonized him, proclaiming also that he was to be venerated as a martyr. Gajowniczek survived Auschwitz and attended both the beatification and canonization ceremonies.




ST. HEDWIG'S FAITH FORMATION PROGRAM
