LIST KSIĘDZA PROBOSZCZA

Drodzy Parafianie i Przyjaciele

Dzisiaj, Chrystus. Zawsze, Chrystus. Od Niego przychodzimy; od Niego pochodzą wszystkie dobre nasiona zasiane w naszym życiu. Bóg nas odwiedza — jak mówi Kempis— z pociechą i z rozpaczą, ze słodkim i gorzkim, z kwiatem i kolcem, z zimnem i ciepłem, z pięknem i z cierpieniem, z radością i smutkiem, z odwagą i strachem... bo wszystko zostało umorzone w Chrystusie (On również czuł strach i pokonał go). Święty Paweł mówi, «Bóg z tymi, którzy Go miłują, współdziała we wszystkim dla ich dobra» (Rz 8,28). W porządku, ale... istnieje tajemnica nieprawości, która nie pochodzi od Boga, i która nas przenika i niszczy ogród Boga, którym jest Kościół. I chcielibyśmy, aby Bóg był “jakby” silniejszy, był bardziej obecny, by rozkazywał więcej i nie pozwolił działać tym ciemnym siłom: «Chcesz więc, żebyśmy poszli i zebrałi [chwasty]?» (Mt 13,28). To mówił Papież Jan Paweł II w swojej ostatniej książce Pamięć i tożsamość: «Cierpimy z cierpliwością miłosierdzie Boga», który czeka do ostatniej chwili, aby ofiarować zbawienie wszystkim dusz, zwłaszcza tych najbardziej potrzebujących Jego miłosierdzia («Pozwólcie obojgu rósć aż do żniwa» (Mt 13,30). A jako Pan życia każdego człowieka i ludzkiej historii, pociąga za sznurki naszej egzystencji, szanując naszą wolność, tak że —wraz z próbą— daje nam przeobfitą łaskę aby oprzeć się, aby uświęcić się, aby iść do Niego, aby być stałą ofiarą, aby przyczynić się do wzrostu Królestwa.

Chrystus, boski pedagog, wprowadza nas do Swej szkoły życia przez każde spotkanie, każde wydarzenie. Wychodzi nam na przeciw; mówi nam— Nie bójcie się. Miejcie odwagę. Ja zwyciężyłem świat. Ja jestem z wami przez wszystkie dni, aż do końca (por. J 16,33, Mt 28,20). Mówi nam również: —Nie sądzicie; a raczej —jak Ja— poczekajcie, zaufajcie, módlcie się za błądzącymi, uświęćcie ich jak własne członki, tak ważne, bo odchodzą od waszego ciała.

Dear Parishioners and Friends

Today, Christ. Always, Christ. From Him we come; from Him come all the good seeds sown in our life. Saint Paul also tells us, “We know that all things work for good for those who love God ” (Rom 8:28).

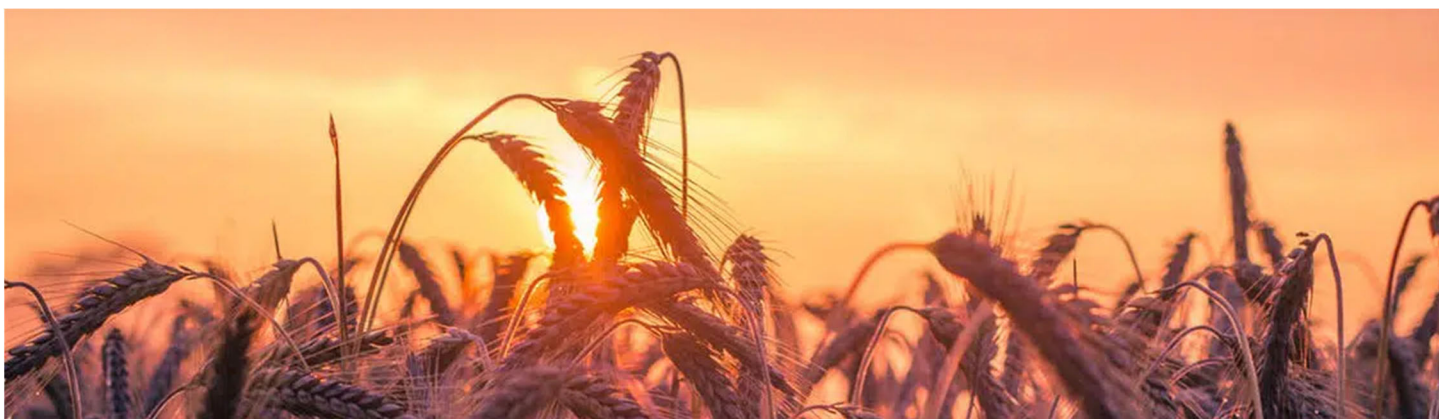
All of this is fine, but... there is a mystery of iniquity that does not come from God and that surpasses us and devastates the Church, God’s Garden. And we would like God to be “somewhat” more powerful, to be more present, that He would be more demanding and would not let these distressing forces in: “Do you want us to go and pull them up [the weeds]?” (Mt 13:28).

Pope Saint John Paul II said this in his book Memory and Identity: “We patiently suffer the mercy of God”, who waits until the last moment to offer salvation to all souls, especially the most in need of His mercy: “Let them grow together until harvest” Mt 13:30. And as He is the Lord of our lives and of all mankind, He moves the threads of our existences while respecting our freedom. And along with our afflictions, we are supplied with overabundant grace to overcome them, to sanctify ourselves, to go towards Him, to be a permanent offering, to grow the Kingdom.

Christ, the divine pedagogue, introduces us to His school of life through each encounter, each event. He comes our way; He tells us — Take courage, I have conquered the world. I am with you always, until the end of the age (cf. Jn 16:33; Mt 28:20). Saint James, Apostle, July 25



Also called The Lord's Brother, (died ad 62, Jerusalem), according to St. Paul, although not one of the original Twelve Apostles. He was leader of the Jerusalem Christians, who with Saints Peter and John the Evangelist is one of "the pillars of the church."

Saints Joachim and Anne, July 26



In the Scriptures, Matthew and Luke furnish a legal family history of Jesus, tracing ancestry to show that Jesus is the culmination of great promises. Not only is his mother's family neglected, we also know nothing factual about them except that they existed. Even the names "Joachim" and "Anne" come from a legendary source written more than a century after Jesus died.

The heroism and holiness of these people however, is inferred from the whole family atmosphere around Mary in the Scriptures. Whether we rely on the legends about Mary's childhood or make guesses from the information in the Bible, we see in her a fulfillment of many generations of prayerful persons, herself steeped in the religious traditions of her people.

The strong character of Mary in making decisions, her continuous practice of prayer, her devotion to the laws of her faith, her steadiness at moments of crisis, and her devotion to her relatives—all indicate a close-knit, loving family that looked forward to the next generation even while retaining the best of the past.

Joachim and Anne—whether these are their real names or not—represent that entire quiet series of generations who faithfully perform their duties, practice their faith, and establish an atmosphere for the coming of the Messiah, but remain obscure.

Saints Martha, Mary and Lazarus, July 29



Martha, Mary, and their brother Lazarus were evidently close friends of Jesus. He came to their home simply as a welcomed guest, rather than as one celebrating the conversion of a sinner like Zacchaeus or one unceremoniously received by a suspicious Pharisee. The sisters felt free to call on Jesus at their brother's death, even though a return to Judea at that time seemed to spell almost certain death.

Martha's great glory is her simple and strong statement of faith in Jesus after her brother's death. No doubt Martha was an active sort of person. On one occasion, she prepares the meal for Jesus and possibly his fellow guests and forthrightly states the obvious: All hands should pitch in to help with the dinner. The Lord recognizes that Martha is "worried about many things," also noting that Mary, who has spent the preparation time at Jesus' feet listening to his words "has chosen the better part."

Lazarus was the one of whom the Jews said, "See how much he loved him." In their sight Jesus raised his friend Lazarus from the dead.

Legends abound about the life of Lazarus after the death and resurrection of Jesus. He is supposed to have left a written account of what he saw in the next world before he was called back to life. Some say he followed Peter into Syria. Another story is that despite being put into a leaking boat by the Jews at Jaffa, he, his sisters, and others landed safely in Cyprus. There he died peacefully after serving as bishop for 30 years.

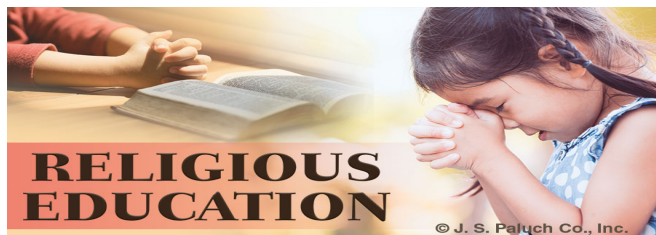
