

CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

Today is the greatest day for a Christian's heart, because, after celebrating the institution of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, the Church now is trying to exalt this revered Sacrament, to make us adore it without limit. "Quantum potes, tantum aude..." (dare to do your best): This is the invitation St. Thomas Aquinas makes us in a wonderful hymn of praise to the Eucharist. And, in a most admirable way, this invitation sums up what our heart's feelings should be before Christ's true presence in the Eucharist. To reciprocate such a humble, hidden, and so impressive gift, whatever we can do will never be enough. The Almighty Creator of Heaven and Earth hides under the Sacramental species and offers himself to us as the food that feeds our souls. He is bread of angels and food of wayfarers. And it is the bread of life we are being abundantly given, just as the bread, to feed and strengthen those following him, was miraculously multiplied and distributed without any measure: "They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets" (Lk 9:17).

In front of this overabundance of love our reaction can never be stingy. An attentive and deep gaze of faith to this Divine Sacrament, must necessarily give way to a grateful prayer and to a passionate heart. In his sermons, St. Josemaria Escrivá used to repeat the words a certain venerable bishop addressed to the priests he had just ordained: "Treat him well for me, treat him well!"

A quick examination of conscience will help us realize what we must do to treat Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament more delicately: the cleanliness of our soul —it must always be in grace to receive him—, the correctness of what we wear —as a sign of love and reverence—, the frequency with which we come closer to receive him, the number of times we visit him in the Tabernacle... Our attentions with our Lord in the Eucharist should be countless. Let us fight to receive and treat Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament with the purity, humility and devotion of his Blessed Mother, with the spirit and the fervor of the saints.

Was it part of God's plan for men to suffer and die?

God does not want men to suffer and die. God's original idea for man was paradise: life forever and peace between God and man and their environment, between man and woman. [374-379, 384, 400] Often we sense how life ought to be, how we ought to be, but in fact we do not live in peace with ourselves, act out of fear and uncontrolled emotions, and have lost the original harmony that man had with the world and ultimately with God. In Sacred Scripture the experience of this alienation is expressed in the story of the Fall. Because sin crept in, Adam and Eve had to leave paradise, in which they were in harmony with each other and with God. The toil of work, suffering, mortality, and the temptation to sin are signs of this loss of paradise.

What is sin?

At the core of sin is a rejection of God and the refusal to accept his love. This is manifested in a disregard for his commandments. [385-390] Sin is more than incorrect behavior; it is not just a psychological weakness. In the deepest sense every rejection or destruction of something good is the rejection of good in itself, the rejection of God. In its most profound and terrible dimension, sin is separation from God and, thus, separation from the source of life. That is why death is another consequence of sin. Only through Jesus do we understand the abysmal dimension of sin: Jesus suffered God's rejection in his own flesh. He took upon himself the deadly power of sin so that it would not strike us. The term that we use for this is redemption.



Rozważanie na niedzielę

Dzisiaj jest największy dzień dla serca chrześcijanina, ponieważ Kościół, po celebracji Wielkiego Czwartku, kiedy ustanowiono Eucharystię, poszukuje wywyższenia tego Świętego Sakramentu, abyśmy wszyscy go bezmiernie adorowali. «Quantum potes, tantum aude...», «Ile zdołasz chwal Go śmiało»: takie jest zaproszenie Świętego Tomasza we wspaniałym hymnie pochwalnym Eucharystii. W tym zaproszeniu mieszczą się uczucia, które wzbudza obecność Jezusa Chrystusa w Eucharystii. Wszystko, co moglibyśmy uczynić jest niczym wobec tego pokornego, skromnego, ukrytego i tak niesamowitego daru. Stworzyciel nieba i ziemi ukrywa się w naturze sakramentu i ofiaruje się nam jako pokarm naszych dusz. Oto chleb aniołów i pokarm tych, którzy są w drodze. A jest to chleb dany w obfitości, tak samo jak ten, który został rozmnożony cudownie przez Jezusa, aby nie pomarli ci, którzy za nim podążali: «Jedli i nasycili się wszyscy, i zebrano jeszcze dwanaście koszów ułomków, które im zostały» (Łk 9,17).

Wydaje się niemożliwe, aby taki bezmiar miłości mógł pozostać bez odpowiedzi. Uważne i głębokie spojrzenie wiary skierowane na ten boski Sakrament otwiera drogę do wdzięcznej modlitwy gorącego serca. Święty Josemaría zwykle powtarzał w swoich homiliach słowa, które pewien stary i pobożny prałat kierował do swoich kapłanów: «Dobrze Go traktujcie».

Szybki rachunek sumienia pomoże nam odkryć to, co powinniśmy zrobić, aby z większą delikatnością traktować Jezusa w Sakramencie: to czystość naszej duszy, która powinna być pełna łaski, kiedy Go przyjmuje; poprawność w ubiorze, jako zewnętrzny znak miłości i szacunku; częstość zbliżania się, aby Go przyjmować, za każdym razem, kiedy uczestniczymy w ofierze Mszy Świętej... Niezliczone są znaki poszczególnych spotkań z Panem w Eucharystii. Starajmy się przyjmować i podchodzić do Jezusa w Sakramencie w czystości, pokorze i oddaniu, na wzór Jego Przenajświętszej Matki, w duchu i z żarliwością świętych.
